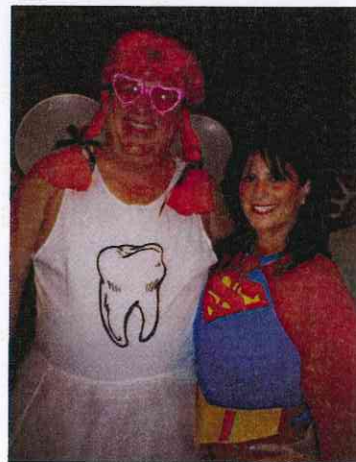

I can imagine how excited the children were, particularly those who had attended the picnic in the past, for Saturday, November 21 to roll around at CB Smith Park. These children - underserved, disadvantaged, maybe orphaned or in foster care, some suffering abuse, had a day waiting for them that was only about happiness...their happiness. It was like a sugar high of fun and it was first class.



Years ago I did a stint as a face painter at a fundraising carnival for my kid's school. I learned how to paint daisies and a butterfly. Let me tell you, face painting has taken on a new life. The clowns were Picasso's creating amazing works of face painting art. Children looked like fairies or animals or elaborate butterflies. There was no complaint as children waited in line because they knew they were waiting for something incredible.

The children also had tattoos applied by the Chrome Angels Motorcycle Club (sponsored by Ed Roer), spent time painting up a storm in the craft tent, played games coordinated by the Junior Dolphin's camp, learned a bit about archery from period actors on loan from the Renaissance Festival, bounced away in bounce houses and were thrilled to hug larger than life Minnie, Mickey, Pluto and other favorite characters.

Barbecuing non-stop, Jimmy Kleinrichert, Steve Feldman and their crew served the perfect picnic buffet of hamburgers, hotdogs, baked beans, potato salad and corn on the cob. It was a "diet be damned" kind of day since nobody could resist the aroma of barbecue.

Through it all Polly was serene. Like a mother duck she gently nudged everything into place. The volunteers were easily identified by their purple tee shirts and knew what to do. The registration tables were well organized. Families quickly got the drift of the day. The children left happy, content, renewed and sleepy. Even the weather held out. As Polly always says, "It's about the kids." Many of them may never ever have the chance to see Disney or Universal or other expensive amusement parks, but they have the Prestige Picnic. A day and event created just for them with love. At the end of the day each family received a \$25 gift certificate for a Thanksgiving turkey.

Prestige Helps the Homeless

Polly Wilkie was called regarding twenty one women and fifty six children who were homeless in Ft. Lauderdale. They did not want our help at first because they did not want to call attention to themselves.

Polly was unable to go on without fixing this problem, so Prestige Club's attorney drew up an agreement that we would not give names out or tell where they lived. Polly had a friend who had fifteen vacant houses in disrepair. He used them for a tax writeoff and did not want to fix them up. Polly convinced him to lease us ten houses for \$900.00 a month, first month free, if we fixed them for him.

All of the women had jobs but just could not afford rent. Firemen painted the homes inside out, we got sod donated, carpets, someone to repair windows, doors and locks. The neighborhood changed, and soon five other neighbors cleaned and painted their houses. We did not mean to upgrade the neighborhood, but it happened.

The women help each other now with transportation and babysitting, and it is like a little community. The homes are well kept and so clean you could eat off of the floors. They said they did not want any food stamps, even though they were eligible. They will only accept help at Christmas and Thanksgiving, and would like to come to our picnic.

We could not afford to sod the back yards so we got someone to show the kids how to plant a garden.

Prestige was once again broke but we are all happy we did it. Each mother has their own bedroom with their kids and we got furniture donated and lots of bunk beds. Good job guys, all of you are wonderful.

Christmas in July Skating Party for Starlight Children's Foundation

Prestige recently partnered with Starlight Children's Foundation for a wonderful night for children who are disabled or ill. Pompano Ice Rink closed on a Friday night and seventy five kids and their families



got to go skating, sled riding and have snowball fights.

They had little walkers with rubber feet so the children would not fall. Food was served and each child went away with a gift at the end.

John Ellingsworth of WorkSpace Supply, was a big hit with the children, taking five kids at a time for a sled ride. Cindy and Wayne Eisen and Sonia Perez also volunteered.

We hope to do it again next year. It was fun.

Wilkie Accepts NSU's Humanitarian of the Year Award

Polly Wilkie was honored as the Ninth Annual Humanitarian of the year by the Nova Southeastern University Center for Psychological Studies at Signature Grand on February 11, 2010. Wilkie, a positive force affecting change in others, has touched more organizations and individuals in need than anybody can count. She is passionate about not only protecting children and providing for their basic needs, she is driven to help them have fun and life-enriching experiences.

Wilkie, founder of the Prestige Club, also sits on many boards including the Florida Initiative for Suicide Prevention, Crime Stoppers, Light of the World, James Jr. Fund, the Boys and Girls Club, and the EASE Foundation. The Prestige Club, founded in 1996, has donated more than \$1.5 million to charities in Broward County. It also hosts an annual picnic for disadvantaged children and their families which draws a crowd of over 3,000 attendees and a volunteer network of over 200 individuals who are drawn to Wilkie and her causes.

Her latest venture, an autobiography entitled *Flight of the Parrot* is filled with touching and humorous anecdotes of life growing up as Polly. A life filled with difficult times including the childhood pain of living with alcoholism, abuse, and abandonment which engendered her rallying cry, "If I can make something of my life, anybody can. It just takes faith, determination and a good sense of humor."

Karen Grosby, Dean of the Center for Psychological Studies, was pleased to introduce Wilkie to the roster of award recipients and said, "Polly takes the challenge of volunteerism to the next level. She doesn't just show up, she is the driving force. Her boldness gets things done." The dinner was a fundraising event to benefit the Student's Scholarship Fund and a scholarship was established in Wilkie's honor.

Over 400 friends and supporters of Wilkie filled the ballroom and enjoyed the evening with Kristi Krueger as emcee who shared some lighthearted stories. Wilkie concluded the evening by having everyone stand and said "This award isn't just about me; it belongs to each of us. I couldn't have done it alone, you made it all possible."

Prestige Club Adopts a Street with A Place Called Hope

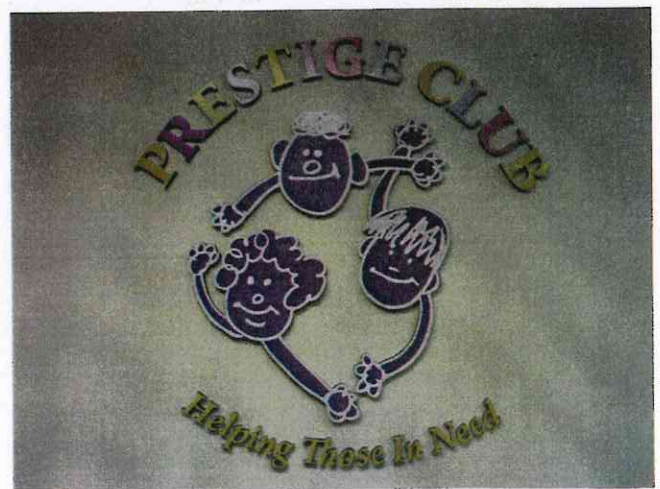


Our street is on Pine Island Road between Stirling Road and Sheridan Street.

We had a large screen TV donated for raffle and lots of golf packages.

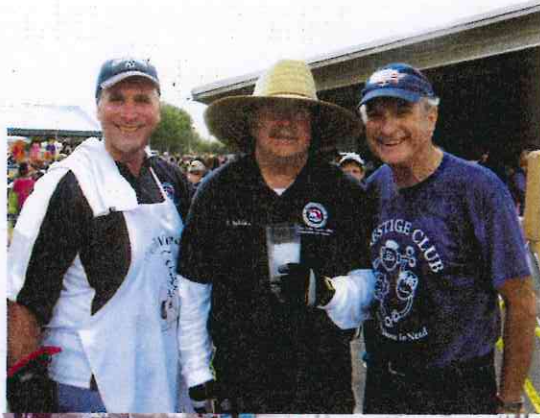
We are looking forward to next year's tournament.
